Assessing the energy transition in China towards carbon neutrality with a probabilistic framework

China's energy system must undergo a significant transformation to achieve carbon neutrality. By combining

Monte Carlo analysis with a bottom-up energy-environment-economy model, 3,000 cases were generated with different carbon peak times, technological evolution pathways and cumulative carbon budgets. The results indicate that if emissions peak in 2025, the goal of carbon neutrality requires an electrification rate of 45-62%, renewable energy to make up 47-78% of primary energy supply, 5.2-7.9 TW of solar and wind power, 1.5-2.7 PWh of energy storage usage and 64-1,649 MtCO2 of negative emissions. This would also result in a reduction of approximately 80% of local air pollutants compared to current levels by 2050. The time at which emissions peak and the cumulative carbon budget have a significant impact on decarbonization pathways, technology choices and transition costs. Peaking earlier reduces welfare losses and prevents over-reliance on carbon removal technologies. To achieve carbon neutrality, technology breakthroughs, changes in production and consumption patterns and policy enhancement are urgently needed.

Blockchain and Firm Total Factor Productivity: Evidence from ChinaUsing

This paper presents a creative approach to constructing blockchain development indicators using geographical characteristics to investigate the impact of blockchain development on the total factor productivity of listed companies. The findings reveal that local blockchain development can significantly improve firms' total factor productivity. To address endogeneity concerns, the paper combines exogenous policy and geographic distance to construct instrumental variables. Furthermore, the positive impact is more pronounced in non-state-owned enterprises (non-SOEs), non-excess capacity industries and samples with high initial productivity. The results remain valid after robustness testing. These results have practical implications for Chinese listed companies in planning their digital business.

A look at China's economy in Q1 of 2023

China's economy grew by 4.5% in the first quarter of 2023, according to preliminary estimates, as the country focused on promoting high-quality development and balancing domestic and international pressures while also coordinating Covid-19 prevention and control measures with economic and social development. By industry, the primary sector saw year-on-year growth of 3.7%, while the secondary sector grew at 3.3%,

and the tertiary sector saw growth of 5.4%. The positive results were aided by a smooth transition to a new phase of Covid-19 prevention and control, stable recovery of production and demand, and stable employment and pricing.

Von der Leyen warns China — again — not to use force against Taiwan

Ursula von der Leyen, the European Commission president, warned China on Tuesday not to use force in the Taiwan Strait, where the island faces pressure from Beijing. She reiterated her message to Chinese President Xi Jinping during a visit to Beijing earlier this month, and distinguished it from the French president Emmanuel Macron's comments that suggested Europe should be wary of getting drawn into a U.S.-China confrontation over Taiwan. The EU, von der Leyen said, is committed to the "One China policy", which recognizes Beijing as the sole legal government of China but allows informal relations with Taiwan.


