Chinese Public Opinion about US-China Relations from Trump to Biden

Recent surveys have shown that Americans hold negative views towards China, but little is known about

Chinese views of the US and the bilateral relationship. As both countries' leaders face public pressure regarding their policies towards one another, it is crucial to understand this dynamic. This study analyzes how concerns about political legitimacy may affect public opinion's role in authoritarian countries' foreign policy making. Survey results from two different periods, pre and post the 2020 US presidential election, indicate that Chinese views of the US dropped during the Trump administration but improved somewhat after Biden took office. Most Chinese respondents believed their country to be the world's largest and favored China becoming the world's leading power either alone or with the US. However, younger and more educated respondents had more negative views, which were tempered by personal experiences and connections with the US. The study's findings hold important policy implications.

Persistence of land reallocations in Chinese villages: The role of village democracy and households' knowledge of policy

This paper explores the reasons behind land reallocations that have been occurring in rural China despite restrictions imposed since 1998. The authors suggest that village self-governance rules, including the election of village leaders and knowledge of relevant policies, have a significant impact on the implementation of national laws and regulations. Through data collected from 124 villages across four provinces in 2015 and 2016, the research indicates that both village democracy and households' knowledge of the Rural Land Contract Law (RLCL) positively influence the occurrence of land reallocations.

Xi says dialogue only viable way out for Ukraine crisis

Chinese President Xi Jinping spoke with his Ukrainian counterpart, Volodymyr Zelensky, about the Ukraine crisis and emphasized the importance of dialogue and negotiations as the only viable solution. China will send a special representative to visit Ukraine and other countries to conduct communication with all parties on the political settlement of the crisis. Xi also expressed China's willingness to develop its relations with Ukraine and to work with the country to push forward mutually beneficial

cooperation. On the nuclear issue, Xi called for all relevant parties to stay calm and exercise restraint. China has sent multiple batches of humanitarian assistance to Ukraine and will continue to facilitate talks for peace and make efforts for early ceasefire and restoration of peace.
