# The Chinese Conception of Cybersecurity: A Conceptual, Institutional and Regulatory Genealogy

The article discusses the Chinese government's definition of cybersecurity and its evolution over time. It

highlights that China's understanding of cybersecurity differs from the Western perspective and is influenced by its unique political, economic, and technological context. The paper examines Chinese government documents to explore how digital security concerns have been identified by different generations of Chinese leaders and how institutional, regulatory, and policy measures have been implemented to address these concerns.

#### **Towards a Green Nationalism with Chinese Characteristics?**

However, the paper also recognizes the role of social entrepreneurs, academics, and environmental NGOs in promoting green nationalism from the grassroots level. By employing constructivist political theory, the study explores how the convergence of diverse green narratives at different levels can reshape the nation and assert claims to legitimacy. In summary, the paper contributes to theoretical understanding by providing a framework to comprehend the intricate relationship between environmental preservation, nationalism, and authoritarian politics in China.

# Beijing rebukes Japan, Britain over 'anti-China' G7 summit

China's state-backed Global Times labeled the G7 summit an "anti-China workshop" in response to statements issued by the group that singled out China on various issues, including Taiwan, nuclear arms, economic coercion, and human rights abuses. The editorial accused the United States of pushing for an anti-China alliance among Western countries and criticized the G7's interference in China's internal affairs. China's foreign ministry expressed firm opposition to the G7 statement and summoned Japan's

ambassador in protest. Russia, a close ally of China, also criticized the summit for promoting anti- Russian and anti-Chinese sentiment.

The G7's focus on China in its communiqué, mentioning China 20 times, signifies growing tensions between China and the group of rich nations. Despite Beijing's strong reaction, U.S. President Joe Biden expressed expectations of a thaw in relations with China. However, analysts predict that tensions will likely increase further, given Beijing's swift and sharp response. China's summoning of Japan's ambassador underscored the intensity of its anger, particularly regarding Japan's involvement in the G7's criticism of China. The G7's focus on Taiwan and nuclear disarmament raised concerns for China, and Japan was singled out as being provocative in its actions. Tokyo has voiced strong concerns about China's rhetoric on Taiwan and has been actively involved in addressing these issues at the G7 summit.

# China raises basic retiree pensions by up to 3.8% to better cope with aging society

China has raised the basic monthly pension for retirees by up to 3.8 percent compared to the previous year. This increase is part of the government's ongoing efforts to improve the quality of life for retirees in the face of an aging society. To ensure fair distribution, incentive mechanisms are being implemented, such as



rewarding longer payment periods with higher payouts. Each region has the autonomy to determine its own adjustment ratio within the national limit. Pensions can also be adjusted favorably for elderly and remote retirees. Practical measures are urged to manage the pension fund's income and expenditure and ensure timely and full payment. China has a significant elderly population, and as the working-age population declines, the social pension service system faces greater demands.
