Statecraft in the Steppes: Central Asia's Relations with China

The relationship between Central Asia and China is beneficial but uneven, with Central Asian leaders sometimes resisting closer ties with China. This article argues that a "hedging" foreign policy approach, which involves balancing relationships with multiple major powers, is not just driven by external factors but also by domestic considerations unique to each Central Asian country. The article highlights the varying abilities of Central Asian leaders to navigate their relations with China, which is an important aspect of their evolving foreign policy approach.

Environmental Clientelism: How Chinese Private Enterprises Lobby under Environmental Crackdowns

The environmental crackdowns in China have resulted in the closure of many private enterprises, leading them to develop survival strategies that involve lobbying government officials directly or indirectly through business associations. The research conducted on environmental lobbying in Chinese cities shows that larger enterprises, with more economic power, tend to lobby directly using their own political connections. Smaller enterprises, lacking such connections, have to rely on business associations, which are only effective if supported by larger enterprises. The study argues that although stringent environmental policies have reduced the space for private enterprise lobbying, environmental clientelism protects economically and politically powerful enterprises while sacrificing smaller ones in the implementation of these policies.

EU leaders are convening in Brussels for a summit focused on Europe's economic strength and competitiveness, with discussions including Europe's position in relation to the US Inflation Reduction Act and China. One topic of interest is whether the long-stalled EU-China investment agreement, which has yet to be ratified due to Beijing's sanctions against the European Parliament, will be mentioned. Some experts speculate that Beijing may offer Europe a favorable deal to revive the 2020 Merkel-era agreement. However, none of the major economies have publicly expressed interest in reviving the deal so far.
