Transformation of Solid Waste Management in China: Moving towards Sustainability through Digitalization-Based Circular Economy

The article discusses China's growing municipal solid waste (MSW) over-generation problem, which poses serious risks to the environment and public health. It evaluates the recent progress of MSW management in China and suggests that digitalization is a driving force for the country to move towards low-carbon development strategies within the framework of a circular economy. Through digitalization, the waste sector has promoted the 3Rs of waste before waste disposal in landfills, leading to efficient cooperation between the government and private sector, increased job opportunities, and conservation of resources.

Boosting economic growth through energy in Africa: the role of Chinese investment and institutional quality

The article discusses the impact of Chinese investment in Africa and the allegations that it is detrimental to the continent's development. The study examines the effect of institutional quality and Chinese investment on energy consumption (EC) and its impact on economic growth in 21 sub-Saharan African countries. Using a panel corrected standard error econometric procedure, the study finds that energy consumption promotes economic growth, and institutional quality and Chinese investment in Africa are the underlying factors for this positive effect. The results expand the economic growth literature and suggest the importance of policymakers paying attention to bilateral trade and investment with China in Africa.

China to resume issuing al types of visas for foreigners

China has announced that it will resume issuing all types of visas for foreigners, including tourism visas, port visas, and multiple visa-exemption policies, starting from March 15, 2023. The move is the latest in a series of steps to reopen the country's border, following a shift from the "zero-COVID" policy to "living with COVID". The visa relaxation includes the resumption of valid multi-year multiple entry visas and the issuance of visas for tourism and medical treatment. Inbound travelers are advised to consult with their local


China embassies or consulates for more detailed requirements and procedures.

Ma Ying-jeou, former president of Taiwan, has become the first leader from the island to visit mainland China since the Chinese Civil War ended in 1949. Ma has led a delegation of students and academics with him, which he "improve the cross-strait claims aims to atmosphere" by fostering enthusiasm and interaction between young people. The visit by Ma, whose 2008-2016 presidency prioritised closer ties between Beijing and Taipei, carries political implications in Taiwan, and comes with the Kuomintang party (KMT) attempting to balance political goals with the desire to show meaningful relations with China.
