aims:

The course aims to provide a general knowledge of main philosophical and legal issues surrounding the relationship between equality, law and justice.

prerequisites:

The student must have successfully taken the Legal Philosophy (Filosofia del diritto) exam.

content:

The course has two main parts.

In the first part, the course takes on the main reflections and concepts surrounding the relationship between equality, law and justice in the Western philosophical thought. More specifically, the course critically examines essays by the following authors: Aristotle, Chaim Perelman, Hans Kelsen, Alf Ross, Norberto Bobbio, Herbert L. A. Hart, John Rawls, Luigi Ferrajoli.

In the second part, the course applies the analyses conducted in the first part to the study of so-called vindicatory systems and their conceptual relationship with contemporary restorative justice, with an emphasis on the notions of "reciprocity" and "balance" in the offense restitution and reparation.

aims:

The course will propose some historical and theoretical keys for interpretation concerning the relationship between justice (understood as a question that challenges the law) and the legal dimension and its institutionalisation processes

prerequisites:

An adequate level of historical knowledge and a specific knowledge on the fields of law sciences. Especially required is the knowledge of the institutional basis of legal history in Europe.

content:

The lectures will focus on the transition to democracy in Italy by considering the issue of the justiciability of fascism.

After a survey of the features of political criminal law during the Ventennio, the events that took place after the fall of Fascism between 1943 and 1948 will be investigated (in particular the sanctions against Fascism, the Togliatti amnesty, the measures for the purge of the judiciary).

The course will be introduced by some preliminary methodological issues relating to the definition of the history of justice as a field of research in the history of law and to legal transition as an analytical category.
