She has carried out research in cooperation with many national and international research institutes (e.g. University of Pavia; University of Florence; Villa I Tatti - The Harvard University Center for Italian Renaissance Studies; Warburg Institute; S.I.S.M.E.L.-Società Internazionale per lo Studio del Medioevo latino; European University Institute-Department of History and Civilization).

She is member of the PhD Board in Humanism and Technologies (University of Macerata); member of the Excellence in Research Task Force - ERT at the University of Macerata; member of the Departmental Research Committee.

She was PI of the National FIRB project on Francesco Filelfo (<http://philelfiana.unimc.it/>).

She has been a speaker and organiser of numerous national and international conferences. Her main research interests include 15th century Latin philology and literature, reception of classical and patristic texts in the humanistic age, Greek translations in the 15th-16th centuries, cataloguing of medieval manuscripts and the history of ancient books.
