Benedetta Giovanola is Full Professor of Moral Philosophy at the University of Macerata, where she was also Deputy Rector and Vice-Rector for international Relations and Jean Monnet Chairholder (EDIT – Ethics for a Digital Inclusive Europe). She directs the PhD program Politics, Society, Technology and is President of GAIA srl, an academic spin-off for ethical and legal AI impact assessment. Her research focuses on digital ethics, AI ethics and governance, theories of justice, media ethics, and business ethics. She is the vice-president of SEPAI – Society for the Ethics and Politics of AI and past vice-president of the Italian Association for Moral Philosophy. She is PI or ethical advisor in multiple EU-funded projects, expert evaluator for the European Commission, and a regular visiting professor at the Department of Philosophy of Tufts University. Among her awards: Helen Potter Award, issued by ASE (US) and Honorable mention – Best Paper Award, issued by IEEE. She has authored 9 books and 200+ publications, including Ethics for Human-Centered Education in the Age of AI, in “Entrepreneurship and Digital Humanities” (2024, with P. Granata); Justice, Emotions, Socially Disruptive Technologies, “Critical Review of International Social and Political Philosophy” (2023); Artificial Intelligence and Autonomy: On the Ethical Dimension of Recommender Systems, “Topoi” (2023, with M. De Caro and S. Bonicalzi); Weapons of Moral Construction? On the Value of Fairness in Algorithmic Decision-Making, “Ethics and Information Technology” (2022, with S. Tiribelli).
