Research themes proposed: Ontology (properties, substances, events and processes, causal powers, relations); Analytic Metaphysics (especially grounding, ontological dependence, fiction, time); Philosophy of Mind (especially emergentism and dualism); Social Ontology

Other info: My research interests are mainly in the fields of ontology and analytic metaphysics. My most recent works are about the ontology of properties and relations: they include the book *The Ontology of Relations* (Routledge, 2024) and the *Stanford Encyclopedia of Philosophy* entry on properties (together with Francesco Orilia). I am also interested in the ontology of substances, events and processes, causal powers and the metaphysics of causation. I would also be happy to work on issues in the metaphysics of time, fiction, grounding and ontological dependence. Another field in which I can offer expertise is philosophy of mind (especially emergentism and dualism).
