Call for Applications: Postdoctoral Fellowships at MRU – Invitation to Candidates from ERUA Partners

Mykolas Romeris University (MRU) invites researchers to apply for Postdoctoral Fellowship Projects funded by the Research Council of Lithuania (LMT). Applications are open until June 6, 2025, at 16:00 (EEST).

This call aims to promote the involvement of early-career researchers in scientific activities, support the development of their academic careers, and foster international collaboration.

Funding Overview

- Maximum project budget: €130,000
- Project duration: 24 months (full-time research: 40 hrs/week)
- Fellow's salary: €2,910.20/month gross (total €69,844.80 for two years)
- Remaining funds:
 - For project-related expenses (e.g., travel, materials, services)
 - Indirect costs (10% of the budget).

International Mobility Requirement

The fellow must carry out an international research visit (minimum 30 calendar days), which can be split into segments (one of at least 15 days) at a university, research center, lab, library, archive, or another institution abroad.

Eligibility Criteria

- The postdoctoral supervisor must not be the fellow's former PhD advisor.
- The host institution must differ from the institution where the fellow defended their PhD.
- Both the fellow and the supervisor may participate in only one application.

A pre-filled institutional application form is available as a draft template, but the final application must be completed directly in the system.

An evaluation form is also provided to help applicants understand the review criteria.
