A LONG HISTORY OF EXCELLENCE

The University of Macerata (UNIMC), founded in 1290, is one of the oldest universities in the Western world. With over 10.000 students enrolled and about 600 staff employed, UNIMC is the only university in Italy that is specialized exclusively on Social, Economic and Human Sciences (SSH)

Thanks to the relevance of their research activities, in 2017 the Department of Law and the Department of Education, Cultural heritage and Tourism of Macerata have won a competition launched by the Italian Ministry for University and Research. They have been ranked as "Departments of Excellence" in Italy, and rewarded with additional financial support to develop outstanding and innovative pluri-annual research projects.

As outlined by its motto "Innovation through the Humanities", UNIMC mission is to contribute to the development of society through the added value that Social Sciences and Humanities can bring to the understanding of our complex society. Our main strength relies on the capability to manage cross-sectoral and interdisciplinary initiatives, including the establishing of fruitful collaborations with STEM disciplines researchers in order to successfully develop national and international research projects.

AN EFFORT FOR ACADEMIC CAREER DEVELOPMENT

In 2005, the University of Macerata was one of the pioneer universities to embrace the adoption of the EUROPEAN CHARTER FOR RESEARCHERS and of A CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF RESEARCHERS. The University made a formal commitment before the European Commission to draft an Action Plan for the actual implementation of the principles expressed in the Charter through the Human Resources Strategy for Researchers (HRS4R).

On the grounds of the action plan, in 2014 the University was one of the first universities in Italy to be awarded with the **HR Excellence in Research** accreditation and logo. The award recognises the policies and practices that UNIMC has put in place to support researchers' career and professional development, with particular attention paid to the needs of young researchers.

In 2017, the further natural step was to join the **Open, Transparent and Merit-based Recruitment initiative (OTM-R)** in research performing Organisations, just set as top-priority by the

European Commission, by embedding the OTM-R principles in the existing HR Strategy and Action Plan. The actions focus primarily on guaranteeing equal opportunities and access for all, creating an international portfolio for cooperation, competition and equity mobility, enhancing the value of the research career and, in a few words, ensuring the recruitment of the best possible person for the job.
